

**Dominique Ludvigson** served as Associate Director for Legal Affairs in the White House Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives from 2005-2007. In that capacity, she advised the Director and other senior staff on a range of litigation and legal policy issues and worked closely with the White House Counsel's Office and Department of Justice on litigation matters. She was a key liaison between the White House and Federal agencies charged with implementing the Initiative and coordinated legal and regulatory compliance efforts with agency counsel and other representatives. Ludvigson drafted legal guidance on First Amendment and regulatory matters involving grantees and managed legal inquiries from nonprofit organizations regarding grant terms and conditions. She also traveled extensively conducting legal training for thousands of prospective Federal grantees and government officials at White House conferences throughout the country. A native of New York, Ludvigson received her undergraduate degree *magna cum laude* from the American University in Washington, D.C., where she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. She earned her Juris Doctor at the University of Illinois College of Law in Champaign-Urbana, where she was Managing Editor of the *Journal of Law, Technology and Policy*. She is a member of the New York and New Jersey bars. Ludvigson is currently Counsel and Special Assistant to Chairman Gerald A. Reynolds and Commissioner Peter Kirsanow at the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights.
